

Mr. Matsui: Look at this, everyone. This shows the *number of medals Japan has got since 1960. Can anyone tell us anything from this *table?

Koji: Yes! Japan got 17 gold medals last year.

Mr. Matsui: Right. 17 gold medals, 15 silver ones, and 20 bronze ones. Japan got (①) medals *in total last year. Is there anything else?

Mika: I'm afraid the numbers in the table aren't right. I don't think Japan got so many medals.

Mika: I've heard of the Paralympics, but I don't know much about them.

Could you explain some more, Mr. Matsui?

Mr. Matsui: Sure. The Paralympics started as sports games for people injured in wars. Now they are for *disabled people and are held in *the same year as the Olympics. There are many kinds of sports like *wheelchair tennis and wheelchair basketball. You know about wheelchair basketball, Ms. Jones?

Ms. Jones: Oh, yes. A few years ago I watched a wheelchair basketball game in Canada. The teams played very hard. Their performances were exciting, so I became interested in it. Of course, I enjoyed some wheelchair basketball games in the 2004 Paralympics on TV.

Mr. Matsui: Me, too.
Do you know one wheelchair basketball player from Fukushima played in these Paralympics? She got no medal last year, but got a bronze one in Sydney.

Hiroshi: Is that so? I'm a member of the basketball club and love to play basketball. I think the *rules of wheelchair basketball are different and difficult.

Ms. Jones: No, they are not really different or difficult. It's easy to understand them. In Canada, some people use a wheelchair and play wheelchair basketball with disabled people. You can play it together with them.

Hiroshi: Really? I'd like to try it.

Mr. Matsui: Everyone can play and enjoy sports together. I understood <u>athis</u> when I watched the men's *marathon in the Paralympics.

Ms. Jones: Oh, you watched the marathon? How was it?

Mr. Matsui: It was very moving. A Japanese man with weak eyes got a gold medal.

He ran hard with two *guide runners. They ran with him *in turn.

He came in first. He looked very happy with the guide runners. I thought they were a good team.

Koji: We can play sports together with disabled people.

Mr. Matsui: That's right. We can do *anything together. We should try to remember that.
